### SUMMARY / BRIEF DESCRIPTION ABOUT THE PROPOSED PROJECT

Each participating student will present five or more of all threatened species in Europe and Asia. The students are encouraged to present species from not only their own region but they are also allowed to pick a subject somewhere else as long as they stay inside the Asian and European boundaries. Their presentations can be made with any tool as long as you can publish it on the Internet. All work will be published on a website with a searchable database of species in Asia and Europe. All students and teachers will work together on a social network. Besides the database the students may communicate with different available tools.

**RATIONALE FOR THE PROJECT:**

Similar to the ASEF's new strategy focusing on the value of biodiversity and to raise awareness of conserving biodiversity in the communities in Asia and Europe, this project also aims to raise student awareness in environmental and biodiversal issues. The project is inspired by the International Union for Conservation of Natures IUCN Red List of Threatened Species.

**EXPECTED CONTRIBUTION FROM ASIAN SCHOOLS/STUDENTS:**

Each participating student will present five or more of all the threatened species in Europe and Asia. Inspired by IUCN, International Union for Conservation of Natures IUCN Red List of Threatened Species that is widely recognized as the most comprehensive, objective global approach for evaluating the conservation status of plant and animal species, the students are encouraged to present species from not only their own region but it is also allowed to pick a subject somewhere else as long as they stay inside the Asian and European boundaries. Their presentations can be made with any tool as long as you can publish it on the Internet. They can present their work as a PowerPoint presentation, a blog, a website, a movie or use any tool of their choice as long as the work can be published online. All work will be published on a website with a searchable database of species in Asia and Europe.
